### 1) <u>Injury:</u>

- -near misses
- -First Aid
- -Medical Injuries
- -Lost Time Injuries
- -Critical Injuries
- -Occupational Illnesses

## 2) Workplace Violence:

There are three cases that fall under this category:

- The exercise of physical force by a person (Worker, Student or Non-Board Employee) against a Worker in a workplace that causes or could cause physical injury to the Worker;
- 2) An attempt to exercise the above;
- 3) A **statement or behaviour** that is reasonable for a Worker to **interpret as a threat** to exercise physical force against a Worker in a workplace that causes or could cause physical injury to the Worker.

## 3) Safe Schools:

This report is specific to student activities for which **Suspension** or **Expulsion** must be considered, according to the Education Act.

### Activities leading to possible suspension:

306. (1) A principal shall consider whether to suspend a pupil if he or she believes that the pupil has engaged in any of the following activities while at school, at a school-related activity or in other circumstances where engaging in the activity will have an impact on the school climate:

- 1. Uttering a threat to inflict serious bodily harm on another person.
- 2. Possessing alcohol or illegal drugs.
- 3. Being under the influence of alcohol.
- 4. Swearing at a teacher or at another person in a position of authority.
- 5. Committing an act of vandalism that causes extensive damage to school property at the pupil's school or to property located on the premises of the pupil's school.
- 6. Bullying.
- 7. Any other activity that is an activity for which a principal may suspend a pupil under a policy of the board.

#### Activities leading to suspension:

310. (1) A principal shall suspend a pupil if he or she believes that the pupil has engaged in any of the following activities while at school, at a school-related activity or in other circumstances where engaging in the activity will have an impact on the school climate:

- 1. Possessing a weapon, including possessing a firearm.
- 2. Using a weapon to cause or to threaten bodily harm to another person.
- 3. Committing physical assault on another person that causes bodily harm requiring treatment by a medical practitioner.
- 4. Committing sexual assault.
- 5. Trafficking in weapons or in illegal drugs.
- 6. Committing robbery.
- 7. Giving alcohol to a minor.
- 8. Any other activity that, under a policy of a board, is an activity for which a principal must suspend a pupil and, therefore in accordance with this Part, **conduct an investigation to determine whether to recommend to the board that the pupil be expelled.**

# Early Years and Primary Students - from the Ministry of Education -

Junior Kindergarten to Grade 3 Students

Following the July 2020 announcement of <u>Ontario's Action Plan to Address Systemic Racism in Schools</u>, the ministry has created new regulations that change how student behaviour is addressed in junior kindergarten to Grade 3.

The new <u>regulations</u> remove the discretion of the principal to suspend students in junior kindergarten to Grade 3 for activities listed in <u>subsection 306(1)</u> of the *Education Act*, beginning in the 2020-2021 school year. These behaviours should be addressed with

the appropriate positive behaviour supports in the school setting. Activities listed in <u>subsection 310(1)</u> will still be subject to mandatory suspensions, pending the results of an investigation.

There are two very important exceptions to the above:

- 1. EY and P kids can still be suspended for any activities that are listed in section 310.(1) above;
- 2. ANY student can be "excluded" by administration until there is a safe plan (either a revised existing plan or a newly developed one) to allow them to return to school safely.
